Seven Steps for Meaningful Marking:

- 1) Marking should be **helpful** and **targeted**; marking is **for the benefit of pupils**
- 2) Use 'live marking' during lesson time to give instant feedback to help children know what they've done well and what they can do next to improve
- 3)'Tickled Pink' positive comments should be written in pink

'Green To Grow' – areas to improve should be written in green

- 4) Praise **specific effort** and **process**, not just outcomes (growth mindset)
- 5) Not every piece of work needs to be marked; **verbal feedback** is important and effective
- 6) Allow children time to read and respond to marking
- 7) Aim to use **self-assessment** and **peer assessment** regularly for pupil voice and peer-to-peer learning.
